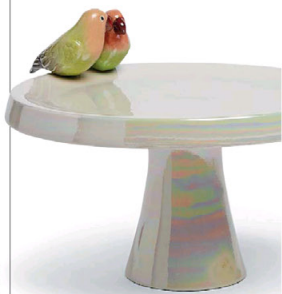
CORAVIN WINE SYSTEM
