The Traditional Family

Following the huge success of Marco Dessí's Basket Chandelier we decided to come up with a smaller version of this lamp for hallways or staircases. It premiered in September 2011 in Vienna's Museum of Applied Arts.

Inspired by the shape of traditional lanterns, Dessí was weaving a basket-like structure using hexagonally bent glass tubes in combination with silken cords. The lighting unit was selected to be a twisted spiral on a slim pole with halogen bulbs.

The silken ropes leave room to create bespoke variants to match the ambience of the perspective room.



A limited edition of 49 was issued with precious massive silver plating, smoke-grey glass tubes and black silken ropes. This was first presented at Superdesign 2010 in London.
